Evaluation SRDP Communications Plan

- Officials unaware of the communications plan
- Officials unaware of who was responsible for its implementation
- Communications ad-hoc in co-ordination
- Communications scheme/measure specific (if at all)
- SRDP equates to Rural Priorities (an individual scheme)
- Website key source of advice, not always up to date
- Transformational approach to rural development clouded
 by implementation challenges & scheme delivery



Evaluation of the Scottish NRN

- Weak engagement and awareness of the NRN amongst stakeholders
- Too focused on certain sections of society
- Too focused on communities
- NRN overlapping with other networks
- Limited use of networking and communications tools
- Limited 'value add' to SRDP

The Scottish Government

The Future?.....NRN

- Enhance partnership working with full range of rural actors
- Focus on promoting and sharing practices
- Facilitate and promote cooperation
- Work with LDS delivery
- Enhanced role in strengthening RDP communications
- Improved governance with stakeholders driving work (rather than Government)
- Enhance working relationship with NRNs, UK NRNs and ENRD
- Proactive in developing relationships with networks outside the traditional 'rural bubble'
