Hungary - background information

- Traditionally agricultural country;
- Land privatization of the last 20 years concentrated ownership structure;
- Small scale farming decreases;
- Growing share of large agro business;
- Eroding work moral in villages.

Key words

- small and medium scale family farm model,
- cooperatives,
- local markets and economy, local employment,
- increasing rural livelihood,
- quality, environment,
- food safety,
- local farmers in focus;





Rural development reality

Land tendering

- Personal changes in the administration;
- Anomalies in land rental results (withdrawn tenders, contracts without tendering, obscure scoring system);
- Lack of transparency in the tendering process;
- Priority of <u>local</u> farmers' did not seem
 to be realized;

Subsidy schemes

- Over-bureaucratic processes;
- System of rules hard to overview;
- Control and sanctions are excessive;
- Many farmers turn away from RD subsidy scehemes;





Conclusions

- Policy and actions often contradict;
- Communication can not compensate policy anomalies;
- Bureaucracy can make communication ineffective (and spoil good ideas).








Our role

- Generating pilots, samples for natural land management;
- Communicate for the local public, foster participation and activity;



- Flood plain management along rivers (water retention, mosaic landscape, diversification of land use);
- Grassland rehabilitation, extensive grazing (local products, processing);
- Animal keeping (poultry, cattle);
- Farm pedagogy for school children;
