Title of workshop:

Territorial Cooperation and Single Market: how to create tangible added value for citizens in cross-border territories and interregional networks

Date & time of workshop: 9 October, 9:00-10:45

Main outcomes:

The European Territorial Cooperation (ETC) aims to bring about the territorial integration of cross-border regions and macro-regions. ETC projects therefore make a major contribution to the Single Market and the Europe 2020 strategy, while showing that Europe produces tangible results at the service of its citizens.

The projects presented in the workshop contributed both to the Single Market and to one flagship domain of the Europe 2020 strategy:

- How to go from brain drain to brain circulation? Improving talent mobility through cooperation among cities in the Baltic Sea Region.
- Erasing border effect in the single market the concerns of the Spanish-Portuguese border regions,
- The joint action plan for the cross-border labour market within PAMINA a project for employment at the German-French border in response to the needs of the citizens and the concerned players.

Conclusions:

The conclusions on presentations are following:

- Mobility in Europe- the attracting of talent for jobs is low in comparison to US. The reasons for low mobility include lack of information, too much bureaucracy and differing visa and residence rules. In general not enough pre-arrival information is available, e.g. on schools, social services and professional and social integration.
- In order to promote mobility, cooperation and employment it is needed to reduce cultural & economic barriers. In particular in the context of cross-border territories, as 40% of the EU population lives in cross-border territories,
