General socio-economic situation in rural areas in the Liguria region

With approximately 1.5 million inhabitants, Liguria, located in the North West of Italy, covers an area of 5,421 km². The territory is characterised by a steep coastline and mountains, with little flat land. According to the RDP of September 2008, rural areas are located on hillsides and mountains and account for 75% of the territory and are inhabited by 17% of the population. Agriculture and forestry represent 79% of the territory; natural areas 16%; and, artificial areas 5%.

The RDP indicates that there are approximately 28,200 agricultural businesses in the region. Many of these are small scale since the average farm size is less than 2.6 ha of Utilised Agricultural Area (UAA), with an average Economic Dimension Unit (EDU) rating of 9.3. UAA in the RDP area amounts to 65,000 ha and much of this is permanent pasture or grasslands (56% of UAA). Nevertheless, floriculture produces 72% of the region's agricultural outputs and horticulture accounts for a further 10%. Other products include wine, olive oil, milk and bovine meats. The forestry sector is not particularly developed but covers 63% of the region.

Socio-economic issues highlighted by the RDP include: an aging population; limited innovation in the tourist sector; declining primary and secondary sectors; restricted employment opportunities in rural areas; on-going conflict between agriculture and real estate; and, limited surfaces for cultivations. However, Liguria has a value added with its ports and logistical opportunities. Furthermore the area has a developed high-tech industry; good tourism potential; lower levels of unemployment and high levels of female employment in comparison with national figures; and significant forest areas.

RDP strategic objectives

The overall objective of the RDP is to "develop competitiveness, environmental sustainability and the overall attractiveness of the regional territory by focusing on integration between the agroforestry sector, environment, energy, tourism and services". To achieve this goal, the strategic objectives are to increase competitiveness in the agricultural and forestry sectors; promote sustainable use of natural resources and conservation of the landscape; and, promote diversification of the rural economy and quality of life in rural areas, all of which is in line with the objectives of the Italian National Strategy Plan.

Taking into account the additional financing provided by the CAP Health Check, the European Economic Recovery Package and Modulation/CMO Wine, the RDP was revised in 2009 to reflect the 'new challenges' facing EU rural areas. RDP amendments included placing further emphasis on initiatives on contribute to water management (which received 26.01% of the new finance), biodiversity (38.78%), improved broadband internet infrastructure in rural areas (14.24%), adaptation to and mitigation against climate change (15.43%) and the production of renewable energies (5.54%). RDP modifications in 2009 reinforced existing measures, rather than introduced new operations.

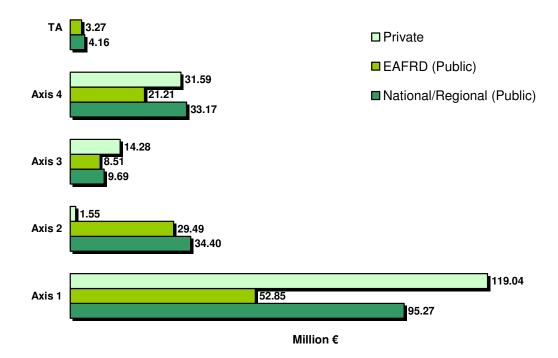
Expected impact / outcomes of the policies

The RDP's expected results are to increase economic growth by \in 31 million; create 180 new employment opportunities; increase labour productivity by \in 1,249.87/labour unit; impede the decline of biodiversity by 3%; maintain and increase high nature value areas by 2,910 ha; improve the quality of water and balance of nutrients in water by 1.4% and 2.1% for nitrogen and phosphorus respectively; and, contribute to combating climate change by increasing the production of renewable energy by 2,851.36 Kton (1,000 tons of oil equivalent).

Specific modifications to impact indicators have been made to take account of the RDP's 2009 alterations. These include new targets for actions such as those: addressing climate change impacts by reducing GHG emissions; strengthening actions related to sustainable water management by reducing the consumption of water; increase in the re-use of waste waters and reduction of pesticides in water; protecting biodiversity; increasing the production of bio-energy from wood and forest by-products; and increased territorial coverage for rural broadband access. RDP budget breakdown by axis: Total expenditure (including national/regional + EAFRD + private funding) of €458,488,674



The RDP budget allocations are broadly divided into four main areas of expenditure, known as axes (namely: Improving the competitiveness of the agricultural and forestry sector; Improving the environment and the countryside; Quality of life in rural areas and diversification of the rural economy; and Leader). Approximately 58% of the overall RDP budget in Liguria is allocated to axis $1 \in 267.17 = 100$ million); Approximately 14% is allocated to axis $2 \in 65.43 = 100$ million), 7% to axis $3 \in 32.48 = 100$ million) and 19% to axis $4 \in 85.98 = 100$ million), with approximately 2% available to fund Technical Assistance ($6 \in 7.44 = 100$ million).

Within axis 1, National/Regional public funding represents approximately 36% share of the total axis funding; EAFRD 20%; and private funds 44%.

Within axis 2, National/Regional public funding represents approximately 53% share of the total axis funding; EAFRD 45%; and private funds 2%.

Within axis 3, National/Regional public funding represents approximately 30% share of the total axis funding; EAFRD 26% and private funds 44%.

Within axis 4, National/Regional public funding represents approximately 39% share of the total axis funding; EAFRD 25%; and private funds 36%.

Within technical assistance, National/Regional public funding represents approximately 56% share



of the technical assistance funding and EAFRD 44%.

As a consequence of the CAP Health Check and the European Economic Recovery Package, together with the programming of additional money from Modulation/CMO Wine, the Liguria region has been assigned an additional $\\\in 15,463,333$ (including $\\\in 9,278,000$ of EAFRD and further $\\\in 6,185,333$ of regional/national public funds). Out of the additional EAFRD contribution, epsilon 9,025,000 derives from the Health Check and the remaining epsilon 253,000 from Modulation/CMO Wine. Overall, these funds are intended to reinforce existing actions and introduce new operations in order to support rural areas in the region.

Axis Information²

Axis 1 objectives: Improving the competitiveness of the agricultural and forestry sector

Result targets for axis 1 include the number of participants who successfully complete a training activity related to agriculture and/or forestry (1,500 participants); increase in gross value added in supported holdings/enterprises (€29.5 million); number of holdings/enterprises introducing new products and/or new techniques (662 holdings/enterprises); and, utilisation of agricultural production under recognised quality label/standards (€3 million).

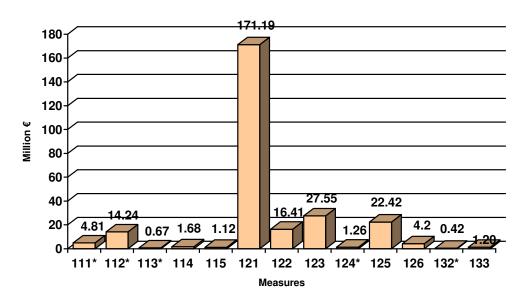
Changes in output indicators for axis following the RDP amendment relate to new support from measures 123 and 125. This will help to improve water management in irrigation systems, water overflow areas and installations of waste water treatments. The new funds will help at least 6 additional holdings undertake around 12 actions covering between 843 and 3,000 ha. Axis 1 budget breakdown by measure: Total allocated budget (including regional/national public funds + EAFRD + private funds) of €267,165,404³



Following the 2009 RDP changes, the amended budget for axis 1 is €267,165,404, which includes an additional €3,833,088 (€2,347,000 of EAFRD plus €1,486,088 of national/regional public) that is earmarked for reducing water consumption through re-use of waste water.

Axis 2 objectives: Improving the environment and the countryside

The table below provides an indication of the RDP's axis 2 priorities.

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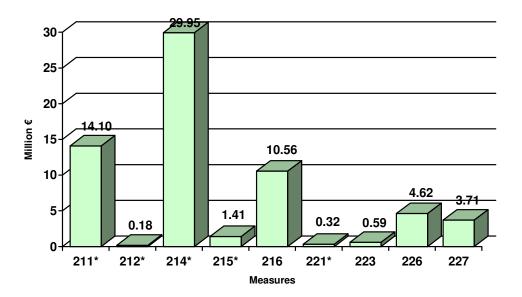

Result targets include areas under successful land management contributing to: biodiversity and high nature value farming/forestry (13,291 ha); improving water quality (6,362 ha); improving soil quality (8,975 ha); mitigating climate change (2,640 ha); and, avoidance of marginalisation and land abandonment (11,240 ha).

Changes in output indicators following the RDP amendment relate to new support from measure 216 for further development of ecological corridors, upgrading of the ecological network and the creation or recovery of small basins/pits in order to ensure good water availability. This will be done by between 12 and 745 actions. Measures 226 and 227 will further address issues related to climate change adaptation and mitigation through up to 20 prevention/recovery interventions. Axis 2 budget breakdown by measure: Total allocated budget (including regional/national public funds + EAFRD + private funds) of € 65,431,382⁴



The amended RDP budget for axis 2 is \in 65,431,382, which contains an additional \in 7,991,181 (\in 4,893,000 of EAFRD plus \in 3,098,181 of national/regional public) earmarked for tackling biodiversity loss (\in 3.5 million of additional EAFRD) and addressing issues related to climate change (\in 1.4 million of additional EAFRD).

Axis 3 objectives: Quality of life in rural areas and diversification of the rural economy

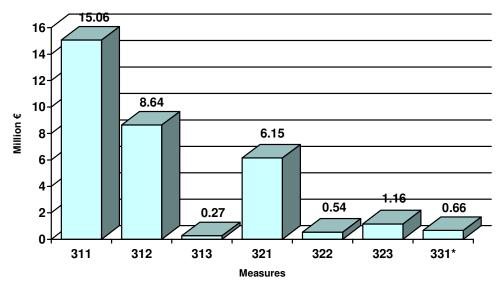

Result targets include the increase in non-agricultural gross value added in supported businesses (€5.5 million); gross number of jobs created (149); additional number of tourists (300); population in rural areas benefiting from improved services (number of inhabitants 81,500); increase in Internet penetration in rural areas (number of inhabitants receiving this service 3,000); and, number of participants who successfully complete a training activity (350).

Changes in output indicators following the RDP amendment include measures 312 and 321. Targets for measure 312 have been increased to support/create 6 additional micro-enterprises using equipment powered by biomass. Modified targets for measure 321 will result in 100 additional actions that improve accessibility to broadband connections in rural areas. Axis 3 budget breakdown by measure: Total allocated budget (including regional/national public funds + EAFRD + private funds) of €32,479,479⁵

The amended RDP budget for axis 3 is €32,479,479, which contains an additional €2,915,238 (€1,785,000 of EAFRD plus €1 130 238 of national/regional public). Around €0.5million of the additional EAFRD will help further develop bio-energy production from wood and forest by-products and some €1.3 million of new EAFRD is available to help complete territorial coverage of broadband infrastructure in rural Liguria.

Axis 4 objectives: Leader

The objectives for this axis are to strengthen the participation of local communities in defining rural development policies; and value endogenous resources in rural areas. No more than 12 Local Action Groups (LAGs) will be established and these will operate across the RDP's thematic axes noted above. Furthermore, inter-territorial and transnational cooperation are foreseen to be financed under axis 4.

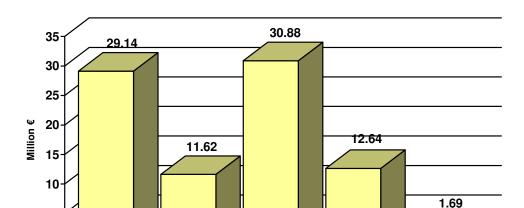
Result targets include the gross number of jobs created in synergy with the other axes; and the number of participants who successfully complete a training activity (10). Number of LAGs operational in the RDP areas as of March 2010 was 9.

There were no specific target or budget modifications in relation to axis 4 following the RDP update.

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Axis 4 budget breakdown by measure: Total allocated budget (including regional/national public funds + EAFRD + private funds) of €85,976,849⁶

Monitoring and evaluation strategy

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The monitoring system is based on the information needs of the Italian Government and the European Commission and uses indicators defined by EC nr. 1698/2005. These track financial commitments against actual expenditure and monitor the progress of RDP interventions, particularly in terms of efficiency and effectiveness regarding achievements of the axes' goals and impacts. Since 2008, the Annual Progress Report of the RDP describes in detail socio-economic evaluations and information on how these interact with the RDP. The RDP is evaluated on an annual basis and the results are entered into the annual progress report (relazione annuale di esecuzione, RAE). Independent evaluators work by analyzing the utilization level of resources, effectiveness and efficiency of the EAFRD programming, and its socio-economic impact. In addition, they verify the level of achieved objectives within the RDP, and identify factors that have contributed to the success or failure of the measures by providing possible elements that more closely align the situation with the RDP's strategies.

Communication and publicity

The strategy is divided into three phases, namely the start phase, in which the EU approved the final document and first information on implementation of interventions; management and implementation phase, during which information on project implementation and monitoring and evaluation activities is given; and, conclusion phase, which aims at distributing information of all results. The main target groups include potential final beneficiaries, final beneficiaries, and partners, such as regional and local authorities, professional associations, economic and social partners, NGOs, in particular equality organisations and environmental organisations, information intermediaries, information centres, Delegations of the European Commission in Member States,
