- In a fast developing agricultural sector farmers increasingly need access to knowledge and information, to training and education, and to facilitating and supporting services.
- Advisory services have always played a key role in making this happen!
- There is however more and more evidence that the links between research, advisory services, farmers and industry are still too weak and that existing models need to be more efficient and interactive.




- In the past, it may have been sufficient to work out solutions in a research context and then pass them down to the farmer through farm visits or face to face meetings in a so called linear process.
- Nowadays we need to involve all parts that could help, be it scientific, organisational or practical to tackle increasingly complex challenges. And we have to connect and enable all useful information sources, aiming to create cross-overs between sectors and disciplines.
- Being interactive is key!

- What will probably never change is that knowledge must be communicated to farmers in a **practical and helpful way**. To improve this situation, for example all EIP Operational Groups are requested to share their practical information in understandable "farmer's" language.
- Also, new approaches need to be developed to enhance advisors' potential to take up the results of Operational Groups and boost their innovation potential.
- The use of new ICT advisory tools is an obvious opportunity.
- But there are challenges as well, such as reaching the smaller farmers.
