

NRNs 2014-2020

Each Member State shall establish a national rural network, which groups the organisations and administrations involved in rural development.

The NRN must include the Partnership under Article 5 of the Common Provisions, *i.e.*:

- ✓ competent public authorities;
- ✓ economic and social partners;
- ✓ bodies representing the civil society.
