## 1. Summary of work programme of the Bulgarian NRN

- The NSU operates under multi-annual work programme.

European Network for

Rural Development

- The tasks of the NRN during the period 2012-2015 will include:
  - Dissemination of information amongst the members of the network on current topics related to the rural development policy;
  - Exchange of experience, knowledge and good practices for rural development from Bulgaria and the other EU member states;
  - Providing a platform gathering the interests and capacity of the NRN members for discussion of effective and feasible solutions for rural development;
  - Providing feedback on current issues and possible solutions related to the implementation of the Rural Development Programme;
  - Cooperation for capacity building and strengthening of the Local Action Groups (LAGs) under the LEADER approach;
  - Encouragement of the cooperation between NRN members at regional, national and trans-national level;
  - Establishment and maintenance of a sustainable National Rural Network in Bulgaria.

# 2. Thematic Initiatives launched by the Network

- The thematic initiatives are defined after consultation with the NRN members, members of the NSU and regional coordinators. A short list of thematic initiatives is then proposed to MA and after consultation between the NSU and MA the thematic initiatives are selected. This process will be initiated again in January 2014 for the themes of 2014 as the NSU aim to be as relevant as possible to the needs of the NRN members.
- The continued thematic initiatives covered by the four thematic groups in 2013 are:
  - "Short Supply Chains in Bulgaria: Status and development Needs";
  - "Definition of permanent pastures and agricultural land of high nature value";
  - "Analysis and definition of small-scale infrastructure for the purpose of the rural development policy";
  - "LEADER approach: Lessons learnt from the present programming period and recommendations to the next one (2014-2020)".

- Thematic issues addressed through events:

- Definition for and understanding of the "Integrated projects" within the framework of the current (2007-2013) and future (2014-2020) RDP programming periods.
- Thematic issues addressed by working groups:
  - "Short Supply Chain" Analysis of the current status quo and definition of problems?;
  - "Definition of permanent pastures and agricultural land of high nature value" "Analysis and definition of small-scale infrastructure for the purpose of the rural development policy";
  - "Analysis and definition of small-scale infrastructure for the purpose of the rural development policy";
  - "LEADER approach: Lessons learnt from the present programming period and recommendations to the next one (2014-2020)".
- Thematic issues addressed in other ways:
  - Organization of thematic working meetings with the regional coordinators and NRN members for discussion of the activity, depending on the progress of the NRN's work.

## 3. LEADER related activities

- The Managing Authority has a permanent staff of 8 persons and other 8 persons are an additional staff with fix-term contracts. All of these persons are dedicated to LAGs support (for example they provide methodological help to the LAGs for the whole period
  - of implementation of their Strategies). The NSU has also one key expert dedicated to LEADER related activities.
- The MA organizes permanent meetings for the LAGs with the whole LEADER unit.





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- The capacity building for LAGs is one of the key activities for the NSU: in 2013 the NSU organized a training workshop for LAGs on Monitoring/EVALUATION of the Implementation of LDS and study trips to events in other MS.

  - Less formal contacts and communication between NSU experts and LAG managers.
- The NSU supports inter-regional and transnational cooperation. NSU carried out a survey on the process for preparation of the project proposals for TNC Measure 421 and it enables contacts between BG LAGs and other MS LAGs.
- NSU organized two experience exchange visits for BG LAGs in European LAGs/events in 2013. The work-plan states that four trips for LAGs from European countries should be organized in 2014 and 2015.

#### 3.1. Relevant Experiences/Good Practices
