

ACTIVITIES OF THE NATIONAL RURAL NETWORK

Lithuania

1. Annual Work Programme (AWP) 2012: priorities supporting RDP implementation

- The LRN maintained a multi-annual work programme, that is included in the LRN Regulation. By initiative of the LRN Members a yearly LRN Action Plan is developed and established.
- The current AWP has been approved on 17th September 2009 with some revisions on 4th January 2011 (according to the LRN legislative documents reduction, the AWP was included to the LRN Regulation).



1.1 Priorities of the current AWP:

- 1. Identification of agricultural, food sector and rural development experience and changes, collection, systematization, analysis, generalization and submission of proposals;
- 2. Dissemination of experience in the field of agriculture, food sector and rural development and other related information;
- **3.** Development of training programmes for the local action groups, technical and methodical assistance in implementing LEADER method;
- 4. Technical support for regional and transnational cooperation of the rural development participants;
- 5. Representation of the interests of the rural development participants in the EU organizations;
- **6.** Implementation of the projects initiated by the Ministry of Agriculture of the Republic of Lithuania and related to agriculture, food sector and rural Development;
- 7. Network management.

1.2 NRN's activities implementing the above mentioned priorities

- Priority 1 Activities pertaining to the realisation of studies and research, as well as innovative ideas related to the agricultural, forestry, food sector and rural development;
- Priority 2— Activities related to the exchange and dissemination of information, such as the organisation of conferences, events, exhibitions, fairs, publications, and participation at the national and international events that are related to the agricultural, forestry, food sector and rural development etc.; The organisation of study visits, workshops and cooperation projects.
- Priority 3— activities for LAG's, related to facilitate implementing of LEADER method, LEADER Programme and Farmers' Training Methodology Centre under the Ministry of Agriculture prepars training programmes for LAG and organizes educational events related to those training programmes.
- Priority 4 cooperation activities among NRN Members and regional and/ or transnational partners, developing of common results.
- Priority 5 participation of LRN Members in EU organization (ELARD, COPA-COGECA, COPA-GEOPA; ELO; PREPARE, ERA, CEJA; IDF, EUROGITES, CEPF);
- Priority 6 LRN Members implemented projects, related to the organization of the traditional fairs, events (AgroBalt, What you sow...Organic products fairs etc.;)
- Priority 7 LRN Members participating in the meetings, related to the LRN activities.

2. Thematic Initiatives launched by the Network

New thematic issues that the network is planning to address:

- Specific issues/ priorities extend LRN Committees before annual (yearly) Action Plan is approved. According to these priorities LRN Members prepare projects.

- LRN Committees for the Action Plan 2012 confirmed the same priorities of the Action Plan of 2011. The priorities are:
- Rural youth committee confirmed the same priority for 2011 and 2012 Promoting entrepreneurship for rural youth;
- Committee on rural policy issues Popularization of Lithuanian products and consumer education etc.

Issues addressed by the events:

- In February the LRN secretariat organizes a meetings for all LRN Committees according to the Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on support for rural development by the European Agricultural Fund for Rural development;
- In May a transnational LAG's fair is organized.

· Issues addressed by working groups:

- The LRN has just one working group related to the new LRN Members memberships.

- Application of good and historical experience for village preservation and revival.
- Enhancement of a traditional farm by preserving biodiversity.
- Preserving forestry potential and sustainable development.
- Landscape formation and management seeking a positive impact on climate change.

v. Committee for innovations and rural research

- Biotechnological innovations in rural areas.
- · Healthy environment and lifestyle in rural areas.
- Development and implementation of social innovations in solving rural problems.
- Application of information technologies in rural areas.
- · Application of technological innovation in rural areas.

vi. LEADER and community promotion committee

- Promotion of sense of community and volunteering.
- · Partnership strengthening among rural development stakeholders.



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- Promotion of community services development in rural areas.
- · Promotion of youth initiatives in rural use.
