From Ongoing Evaluation towards the Evaluation Plan

Background

In accordance with the Council Regulation 1698/2005, Art. 86/1, each Member State shall establish **the system of ongoing evaluation** for the Rural Development Programme covering the period of 2007 – 2015. Its activities shall be reported by the Programme Managing Authorities annually to the Monitoring Committee and included in Annual Progress Reports. The main purpose of the ongoing evaluation is to examine the progress of the programme, draw up proposals for changes to improve its quality and implementation and prepare mid-term and *ex post* evaluation.

The legal proposal for Rural Development Regulation (COM (2011) 627/3) for the 2014 – 2020 programming period* require an evaluation plan to be drawn up, which will provide the basis for evaluation during the programming period (Art. 49 of the legal proposal COM (2011) 615 for CSF funds). The Rural Development proposal specifies that the evaluation plan shall be submitted with the draft RDP and provides for the minimum requirements of the evaluation plan to be set out in an implementing act.

Thus there are challenges for the transition between the two programming periods, and how to use experiences of MS from ongoing evaluation in the preparation and the implementation of the evaluation plan.
