# **Background**

Context indicators reflect the state of the economic, social or environmental situation of the territory, in which interventions of Rural Development Programmes are implemented during the EU programming period. In the RDP design stage the context indicators are used in the SWOT analysis and in the assessment of needs the prerequisite of the definition of the programme strategy.

Hence, context indicators serve two purposes at different stages of programme implementation:

- During programming: to contribute to the identification of strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats within the region in order to establish an intervention logic which addresses the most relevant needs.
- During evaluation: to help to assess and interpret impacts achieved within the programme in light of the general economic, social, structural or environmental trends.

In the meeting of the Evaluation Expert Committee on 20 September the representatives of the Member States screened the list of context indicators from the current programming period to assess their relevance for the 2014-2020 period and suggested additional ones.


Underground map >>>
