



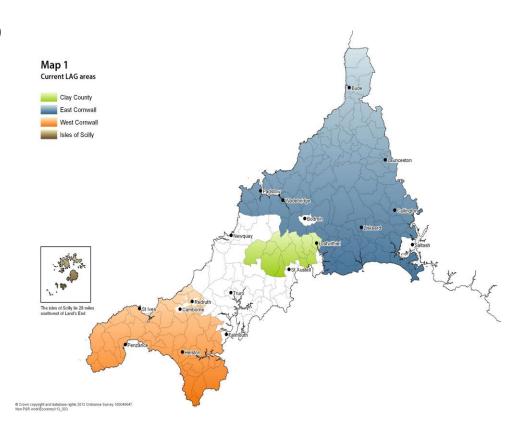
### **Experiences of the LEADER/CLLD approach**

- LEADER I two of the very first areas to adopt this mechanism
- LEADER II 4 LAG's
- Objective One no LEADER+ but adopted principles across programme delivery



#### **2007 – 2013 delivery**

- 4 LAGs, not 100% coverage
- EAFRD only
- Aligned to Convergence ESF, ERDF and wider RD funding
- FLAG delivers EMFF



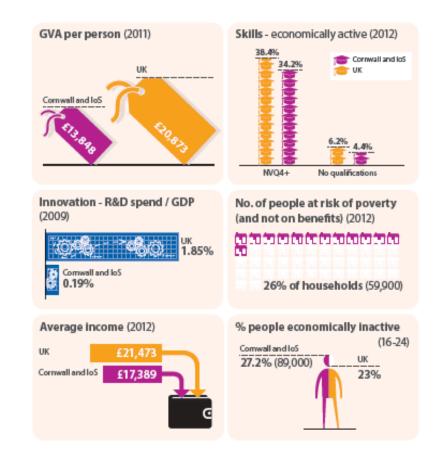


## **2014 to 2020 delivery**

- Economic challenges remain
- GDP remains below 75% of the EU average so Less Developed Area Status confirmed
- Local Enterprise
   Partnership in place
   to set overall
   strategy

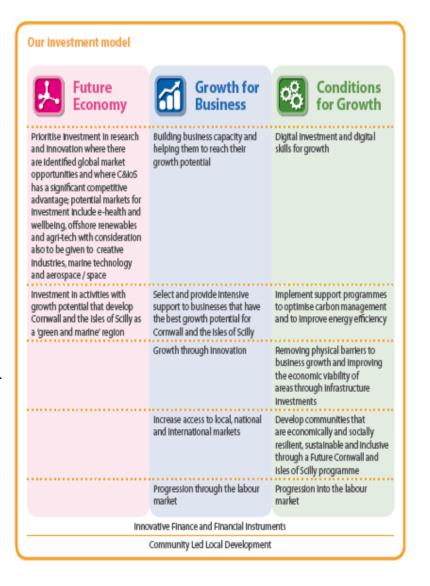
#### Our economic challenges and barriers to growth

Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly has a GDP which stands at 72% of the EU average. Despite impressive growth rates and a significant pre-recession improvement (peaking at 78% in 2006), structural weaknesses remain within our economy. The main economic characteristics of the region are set out below;



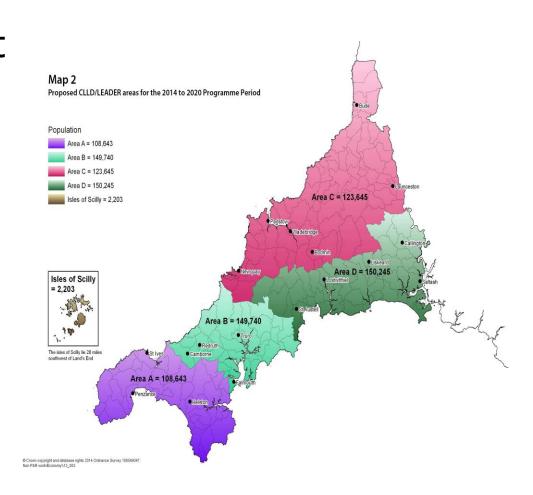
#### 2014 to 2020 delivery (proposed)

- LEP has decided to deploy 5% of ESF and ERDF budget via the CLLD/LEADER approach (circa €29m)
- EAFRD will be accessed via LEADER
- Will sit as part of wider programme delivery mechanisms



### **2014 – 2020 delivery (proposed)**

- Building on current structures
- 5 LAGs 100% coverage
- Rural/Urban coverage
- EAFRD, ESF and ERDF in same LAGs
- FLAG continues to deliver EMFF
