Responsibility for the management of the Budget (MAs or LAGs)	The Managing Authority is responsible for the TNC budget administration.	
Special budget for the preparatory technical support of TNC projects	No specific budget has been put in place for the preparation of TNC projects. However, financing of preparatory actions to initiate a TNC project may be applied for as part of the TNC project application itself.	

2. PROGRAMMING ASPECTS	
Local Development Strategies and TNC	LAGs have included Cooperation in their local development strategy. Those LAGs, which have not included Cooperation in their local development strategy, may still submit TNC project applications.
Way of selecting coop- eration projects	The LAG is in charge of project selection. The approval is issued by the relevant subordinate approval authority of the Ministry (MA), i.e. the authorities for Geoinformation, Land Development and Real Estate (GLL).
Main topics of TNC proposed for the 2007- 2013 programming period	Cooperation projects relate primarily to the tourism theme.
Cooperation with third countries	There are no restrictions defined regarding cooperation with third countries. In accordance with the EARDF regulation, funding is available for LAGs to undertake TNC projects with another Leader group, or with a group taking a similar approach, in another region, Member State, or even a third country.
Maximum/minimum number of TNC projects per LAG	No requirement has been established concerning the number of TNC projects a LAG may engage in.

Selection criteria for cooperation projects	Project selection criteria are determined by the LAGs, which are also in charge of carrying out the project selection.	
Eligible activities of measure 421 Coopera- tion	All measures of the RDP may be addressed by means of Cooperation. Activities supporting the implementation of the joint project include joint seminars, events, studies, research/analyses, public relations and evaluation of results.
