NETWORKING PRIORITIES



Coordination with and support to the NRNs:

- Sharing information and knowledge with all networks
- Meetings between CP-NRNs; "compendium" of information about NRNs.
- Collecting examples illustrating RDP implementation ("good practice")

Promotion of cooperation between all stakeholders:

NSUs; CC members of NRNs; national, regional, local authorities; professional organisations;
scientific institutions; NGOs; individuals

Specific support to LAGs and transnational cooperation:

Development of on-line information and databases (partner search tool, TNC Guide, etc)

Activities addressing the specific needs of networks:

Thematic initiatives of NRNs, other "clusters" of NRNs, etc.






TRANSNATIONAL COOPERATION



THEMATIC AND ANALYTICAL WORK



Thematic working groups (TWG 1, 2, 3 & 4)

- Complementary analysis of RDPs and monitoring indicators
 - Summaries of RDPs in a compendium;
 - Screening of RDPs, e.g. as regards "Climate change";
 - Analysis of databases of monitoring indicators.
- Identification of relevant examples/'good practices'
 - In cooperation with NRNs


