# 1. Annual Work Programme (AWP) 2012: priorities supporting RDP implementation

- The network maintains an annual work programme. The current AWP has been approved on December 2011.
- The main priorities of the current AWP are to strenghten the effectiveness of the Rural Development programmes for Mainland Finland and the Åland Islands and to inform LAGs of their possibilities.
- The Finnish Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, the Finnish Agency for Rural Affairs, the Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment, the Leader action groups and the third sector together implement these priorities.

# • Identification, communication and dissemination of EAFRD-funded projects representing relevant experience:

- Through the Best Practises 2012 competition, the Rural Network wishes to highlight the best projects and measures implemented as part of the EU-funded rural development programmes. The process starts in the spring when Leader-groups can sign up as candidates for the competition. Regional authorities choose one Leader-group to represent their region. The jury selects four semi-finalists to every category. This year there were 5 categories. Also the most outstanding Leader-group was chosen. The winners are announced in the Rural Gala, which gathers together rural developers, entrepreneurs, politicians and decision makers. The Best Practices are then distributed by contact point.
