BUILDING THE EVALUATION CULTURE IN TUSCANY - LOCAL LEVEL LEADER EVALUATION SUPPORT FOR LAGs

STRENGTHENING LOCAL LEVEL EVALUATIONS

LAGs in the past were only the subject of evaluations at the RDP level, but in the programming period 2014-2020, Local Action Groups (LAGs) are asked to go one step further. According to article 143 (3) of the Common Provisions Regulation (EUFOR), each LAG shall carry out specific monitoring and evaluation activities related to their CLLD strategy. In practice, this may include a self-assessment or externally commissioned independent external evaluation of their CLLD strategy. To organize this process has been particularly challenging for LAGs, but also for the Managing Authorities and other actors (PDRs) aiming to guide and support LAGs in these activities.

The factbook focuses on Tuscany's efforts to strengthen evaluation knowledge and culture among the LAGs and other evaluation stakeholders.

BUILDING EVALUATION KNOWLEDGE THROUGH A PARTICIPATORY APPROACH

While evaluation activities can be very helpful and provide deeper insights at the local level, it has become clear that to achieve this it requires a specific skill set that is not always available within the staff of LAGs. Nevertheless, Tuscany believed that this could serve as an opportunity:

- To engage LAGs with core and profitable skills that could be used beyond the fulfillment of any obligation.
- To illustrate the value of evaluation both at the local and governance level and the benefits it can bring about to improve performance.

Therefore, the objective of this evaluation support activity was to coordinate, guide and support all seven LAGs in Tuscany with their first attempt at local level LAG-level evaluation activities. The support process was based on a participative and inclusive approach. The support period started in October 2019 and concluded in February 2020 with the objective to create a methodology suited to each LAG's needs and capabilities. The building blocks and the methodological framework were the same for each LAG and included the standard evaluation questions, judgement criteria, indicators, metrics, but the contents were different for each LAG according to their needs and specific situations. By doing so, this activity provided each LAG with the essential knowledge and capacity to either organize their own self-assessment or know what to look for when contracting an external external evaluator for an evaluation.

Furthermore, this support activity looked to stimulate LAGs to go beyond simply fulfilling the requirement and looked to help them to truly understand the meaning of evaluation, which can also be used as a tool to improve their performance and better implement their strategies for the future. It is important to highlight the importance of this activity for the evaluation of LAGs at the RDP level as it gives more capacity to LAGs and can therefore assist in the collection of more relevant data making it more useful and its dissemination.

The main action that was involved were the Region and the MA facilitating evaluation LAGs, national authorities and other stakeholders/beneficiaries. The evaluator for this process served as an evaluation expert that facilitated the LAG-level self-assessment activities.

This process was divided into two main stages:

- The facilitating evaluator backed by the Region and the MA carried out various participatory activities involving LAGs, other evaluation stakeholders and local authorities (e.g. mayors and provincial local authorities) collectively at all the main topics of evaluation could be used to develop a systematic methodology that would allow LAGs to answer the evaluation questions identified.

The Birds@Farmland initiative of the European Commission aims at supporting EU Member States in conserving wild birds living in agricultural landscapes. The initiative will develop twenty farmland bird conservation schemes in ten Member States (Austria, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Germany, Spain, Finland, France, Hungary, Italy, and Portugal) based on sound scientific knowledge and agricultural and land management practices proven to work.

The initiative aims at involving agricultural and environmental authorities, farm advisory services, farmers' organisations, NGOs, land users, and experts in the process. Through workshops and stakeholder meetings at national and EU levels, Member States are invited to consider these conservation schemes that will be developed in the course of 2021 in their CAP Strategic Plans as well as other relevant policy tools. All EU Member States are invited to participate in the initiative to share their experience and to reinforce their measures for farmland birds.
