





# Jordbruks Broadband infrastructure and the National Strategic Plan for RDP

- Investments in basic services and broadband infrastructure already part of the NSP and RDP
- Until 2010 however limited interest and use of measure 321 Basic Services
- The role of broadband infrastructure strengthened in NSP 2010 – "People living in rural areas need to have access to basic services and be a part of the information society."

# Our Solution – Focus on local commitment

- Make use of local involvement and initiatives
- Knowledge of local conditions and needs
- Encourages local co-financing
- Easier access to land/private property
- In sum, this solution was considered to be more efficient than large-scale national projects
- Efficiency = Stronger and faster impact at a lower cost





## A "Typical" example

- Local need for better broadband technology leads to local initiative
- Local group create economic association
- Association applies for broadband support within the RDP
- If application is approved, the project is realized with additional local private contribution in order to scale up the investment
- Association owns the broadband infrastructure
- Call for tender for running of the broadband technology



Fast – The procedure is fast (Dialogue among involved agencies). Money on a first-come first-serve basis




Secure – The applications are controlled to ensure high quality and robust broadband networks
