

Background

The assessment of environmental results and impacts has turned out to be particularly challenging for Member States during the midterm evaluation of the RDPs 2007-2013. The Evaluation Helpdesk's "Methodological Assessment of MTE-reports of 2007-2013 RDPs" observed that, "The four environmental impact indicators (biodiversity, High Nature Value, water and climate change) had been assessed less thoroughly than the socio-economic ones. Rigorous quantitative analysis seemed to pose difficulties considerably more environmental indicators, which in many cases had to be adjusted to the regional specificities".

While most Managing Authorities (MA) are currently approaching the ex post evaluation of 2007-2013 RDPs (preparation of ToR, selection of evaluator, deciding on an evaluation approach), they are simultaneously establishing the basics for the assessment of environmental impacts for the new RDPs for the 2014-2020 period. This is a critical time to reflect on the practical problems in assessing environmental impacts, in the context of the ex post evaluation, and to determine what lessons can be drawn for the new programming period.
