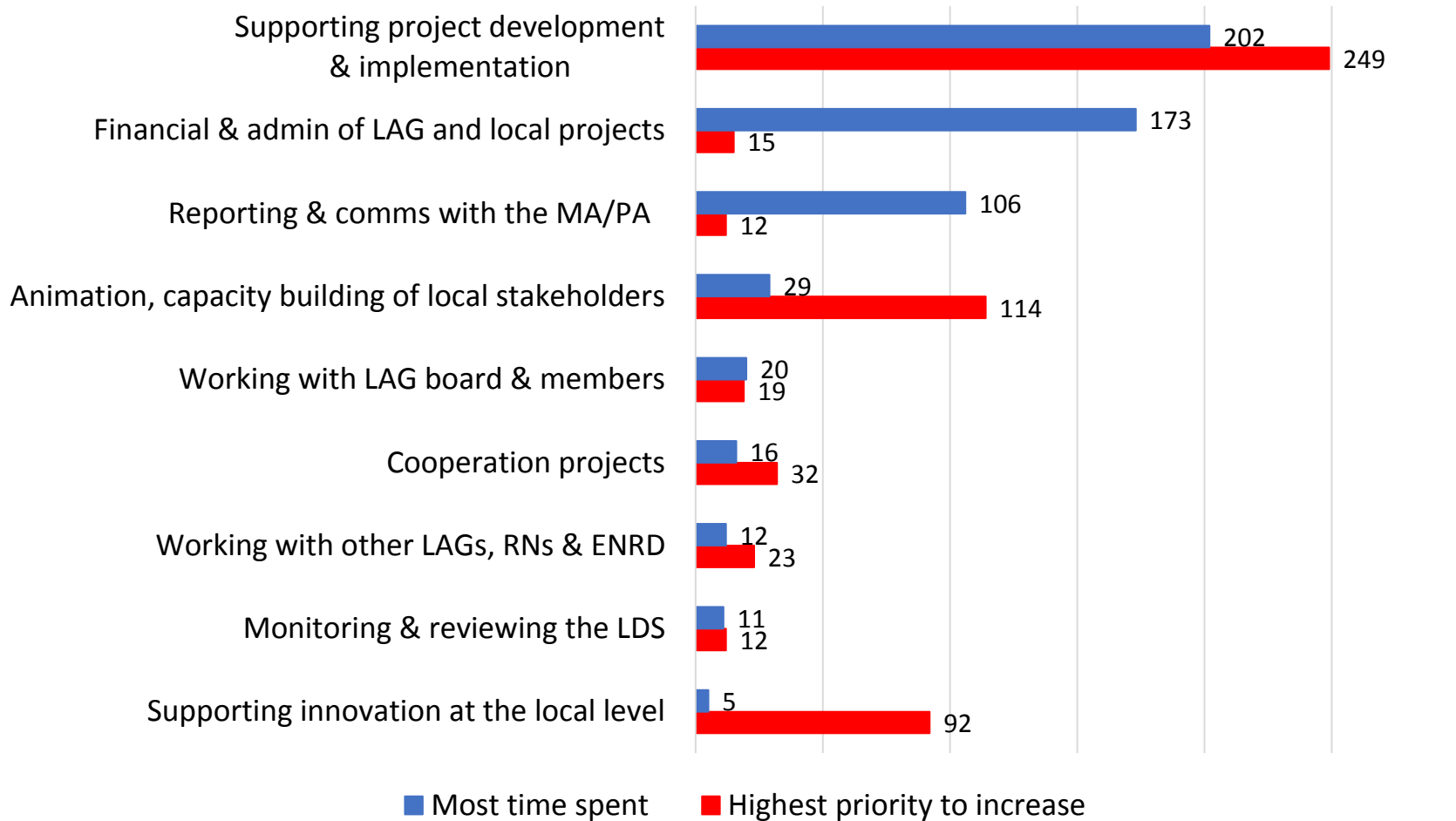

Selected action points from 2018

- Animation / LEADER approach toolkit, practical examples
- Better information sharing, peer to peer, mentoring, connections
- Platform for MA preparation
- EU technical workshops – LAGs simplification workshop
- Practical system e.g.s, understand roles, get governance right
- Understand real EU level added value sought
- LAG / MA coordination groups - get PAs more involved
- Good quality added value info, LAG / LDS level, qualitative/quantitative
- Review delivery, reduce burdens, no of controls - focus on the local objectives, 'LEADER in order to?'

Optimising Success Factors Now

- ✓ **Cooperating with other LAG territories:**
 - 95% very/important
 - 67% achievable
- ✓ **Strengthening public private partnerships:**
 - 95% very/important
 - 57% achievable
- ✓ **Directly addressing local issues and opportunities :**
 - 99% very/important
 - 63% achievable
- ✓ **Strengthening stakeholder participation in governance:**
 - 98% very/important
 - 56% achievable
- ✓ **Finding innovative solutions to local problems:**
 - 97% very/important
 - 33% achievable

Ways to Improve LEADER

-  Simpler application forms / process (53%) ;
-  Simpler and more proportionate system of controls (for smaller projects) (53%);
-  Improving turnaround time on approving selected projects (39%);
 -  Simplification, harmonisation and flexibility to support LAGs in the practical use of multi-funding (35%); and
 -  Better common knowledge and networking between LAGs, MA/PA & NRNs (34%).

KEY LESSONS LEARNT

The essentials: Local innovation, sufficient resources for animation. ‚local innovation culture‘

EU rules: No LEADER innovation-specific control requirements at EU level

Attitudes: ‚fear of failure‘, ‚full risk avoidance‘, ‚building trust‘, ‚know what you don't know‘ – these matter in developing MS-level innovation-specific rules for LEADER and dealing with errors detected

Delivery chain: Accept diversity of local contexts (LDSs) that define LEADER innovation

All LEADER stakeholders: Conscious effort from all to build trust, cooperate, coordinate

'Rust' success factors: Now

- Additional indicators, tangible evidence, help 'external' stakeholders understand
- Open and flexible delivery system, accountability ensured
- An active LAG - designing and implementing - identifying and using local knowledge
- Strong partnerships, commitment and enjoyment
- Cooperation and communication
- Supporting collective actions
- Networking locally - tackling local issues
- Seed corn for larger scale activity

'Rust' success factors: Future

- Tell the added value story better to a wider audience
- Enriched qualitative indicators and processes, examples
- Tackle new challenges, specific priority target groups
- An enabling delivery system, include LAGs in designing
- Build trust in local decision making
- Capacity for animation, preparing the ground
- Working group on results orientation
- Small projects, collective projects, experiments
- Strengthened NRN role
- Coaching, peer to peer
