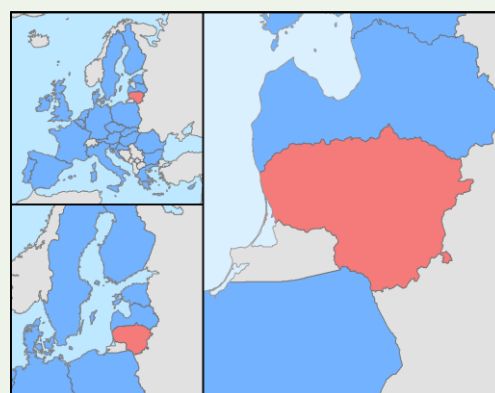

#### Examples of expected achievements

- The RDP will support investments in the modernisation of more than 5 000 farms (2.5 % of the total number of farms), the development of more than 2 700 small farms and the setting up of more than 1 100 young farmers.
- Seven EIP Operational Groups will be established. In order to improve the competitiveness of farming and forestry, more than 60 000 people will also be trained.
- The RPD aims to better integrate more than 600 farms into the food chain and into the overall market. Almost 1 500 farmers will take part in a risk management scheme so that they can improve the insurance cover.
- The programme will encourage the conversion to, and maintenance of, organic farming (135 000 ha will be supported). Nearly 150 000 ha of agricultural land will be under voluntary agri-environmental and climate-related commitments by farmers.
- More than 6 % of agricultural land will be under agri-environmental and climate-related commitments by farmers so that Greenhouse Gas (GHG) and ammonia emissions are reduced.
- The RDP aims at non-agricultural business development and nearly 1 000 projects will be supported. Almost 2 000 jobs will be created, of which half will be created under LEADER through 50 Local Action Groups (LAGs).

#### Examples of key challenges

- The agricultural sector in Lithuania faces important challenges including a low competitiveness of small and medium-sized farms; the low productivity of labour; a polarised farm structure with more than 40 % of farms being less than 5 ha; an unfavourable age structure etc.
- Key challenges also concern the environment and land management are the preservation and improvement biodiversity; halting the decrease of the Farmland Bird index; reducing water and soil pollution from agriculture; addressing soil acidity and erosion etc.
- The unemployment rate in rural areas is 17 %, much higher than the EU average. Although rural tourism is growing, there is still a lack of businesses and jobs in rural areas and only 15 % of the SMEs are in rural areas.
- The rural population is falling and the average age of those that remain is increasing. 40 % of rural people are living below the poverty threshold.

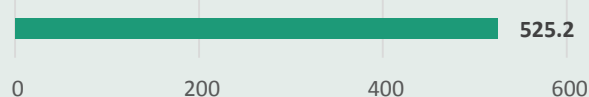

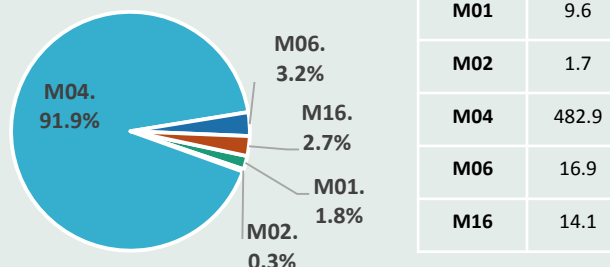

##### Total public budget (million EUR)



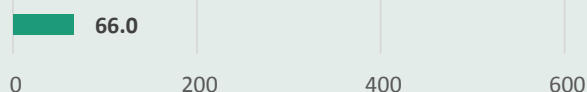
##### Breakdown of FA budget by measure (%)



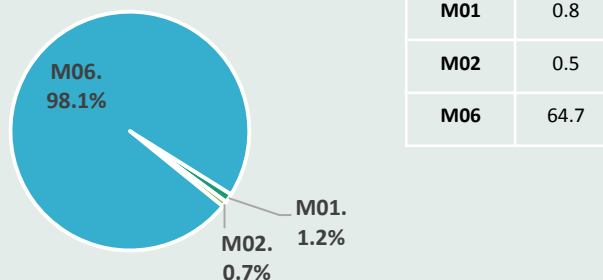

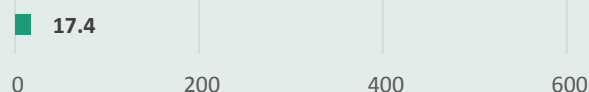

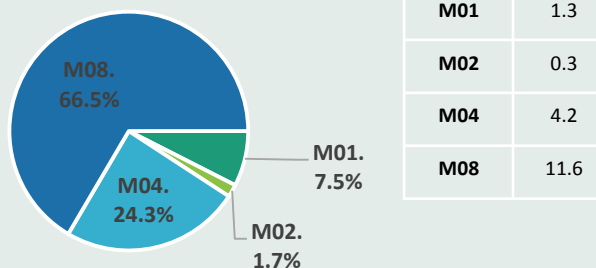

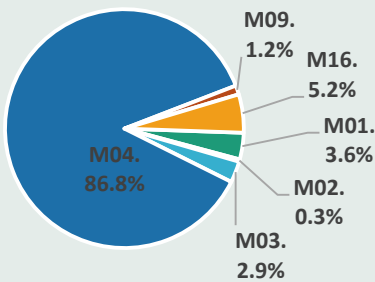

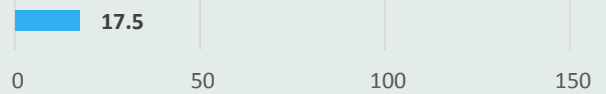

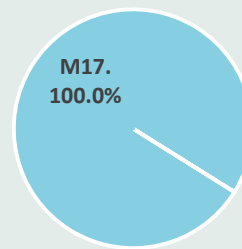

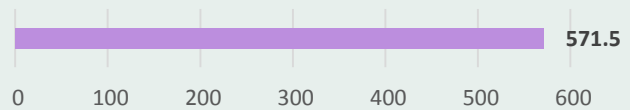

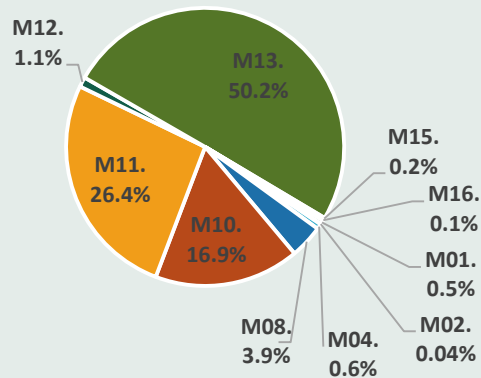

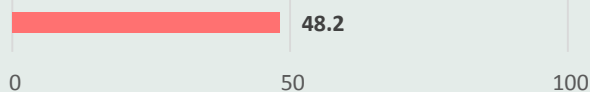

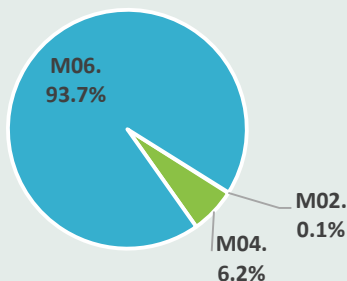

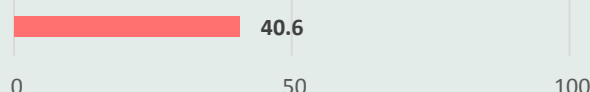

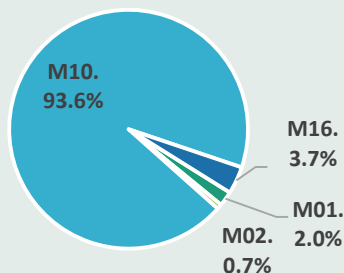

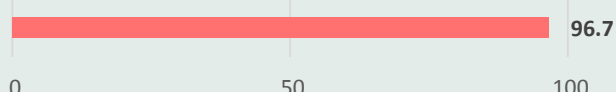

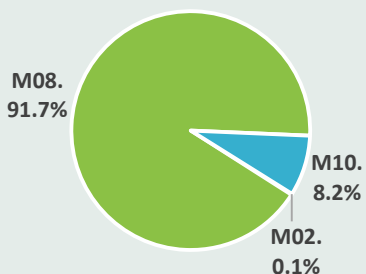

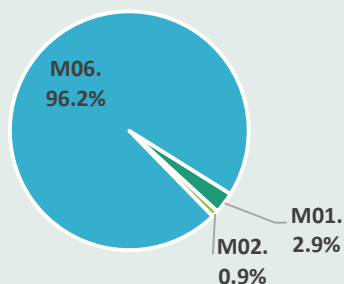

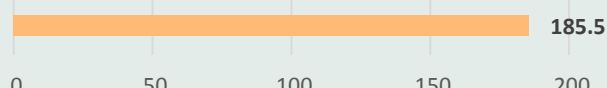

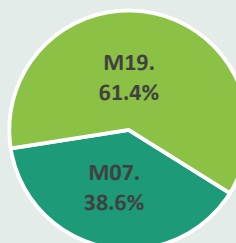

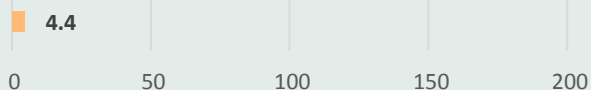

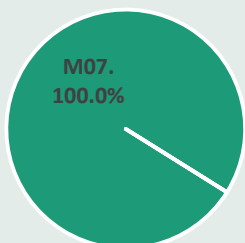

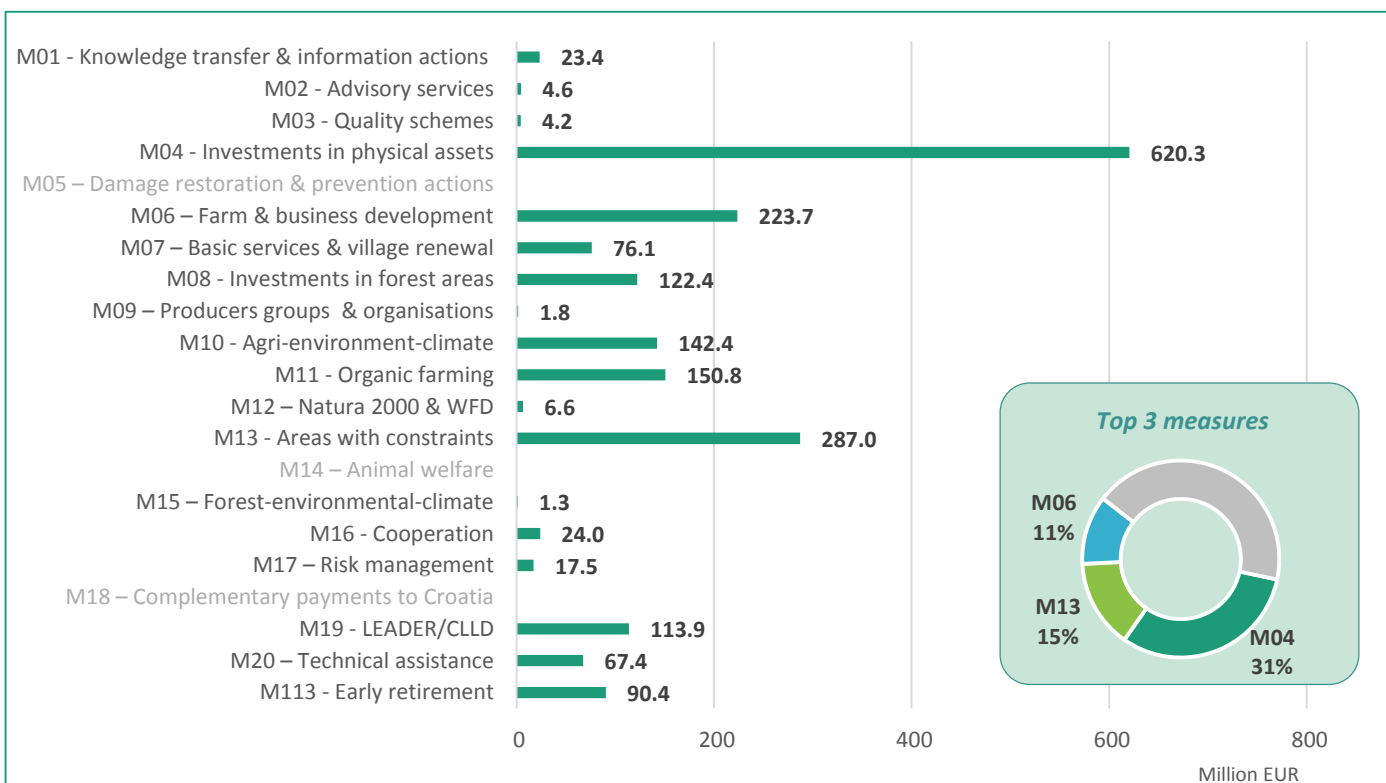
