

Good Practices – some criteria

- Contribution to improving delivery
- Project Benefits
- Suitability of the project to addressing needs
- Synergy with other EU funds and initiatives
- Job creation
- Transferability to other Member States





Good practices – Common Networks Statistics data

Number of good practice examples/case studies both collected and disseminated in 2016: 1 889

The higher numbers in 2016 reported in: Finland (776), Austria (200), Estonia (178), Germany (167), Czech Republic (147)

- Thematic focus mostly on LEADER/CLLD & LAGs (incl. cooperation)
 (P6) 510 out of 1 889
- Reported examples of specific topics: forestry, tourism, mobility, agriculture, local food, diversification of activities, rural services, networking, good practices from other funds





2. Proposal for a Good Practices competition

Why a competition?

- 1. Create 'added value' to the collection of Good Practices funded under the 2014-2020 programmes.
- 2. Provide **visibility to project promoters** and to add to the ENRD **communication** efforts (providing content for articles, publications, online media, etc.).
- 3. The development of this type of visibility will also help with communicating to the **general public**.

Cooperation



Possible timeline

November • Discussion of the process at the 9th NRN Meeting 2017 January Launch 2018 Mid -March Submission of examples 2018 • Clarification on any key questions to be resolved April 2018 (budget, outcomes, etc.) Winners June 2018 announced



Other suggestions

- Only 2014-2020 projects
- Each NRN to submit up to two GPs per category
- Nomination process may differ between NRNs, but inform the Contact Point
- Using the Contact Point template to ensure consistency at EU level
- Appoint a jury / members not voting for their country and use average score
- Possibly, include Operational Groups
- Provisional, align with Innovation competition under conditions
