

Principles and criteria for themes

Wide interest across EU:

- is this theme relevant for your institution/organisation/country
- Are you prepared to work with it?

Time relevance:

 most important at this point of the rural development programming cycle

Past lessons:

• To what extent has this theme been approached at the EU level?

Balance:

- Between "methodological" and "topic"-based themes
- Between different rural development objectives

- Good balance between themes
- Clear interest and urgency to focus on the launch of the new RDPs (time relevance)
- Good initial discussion on topics and issues, but still scope for sharpening the focus
