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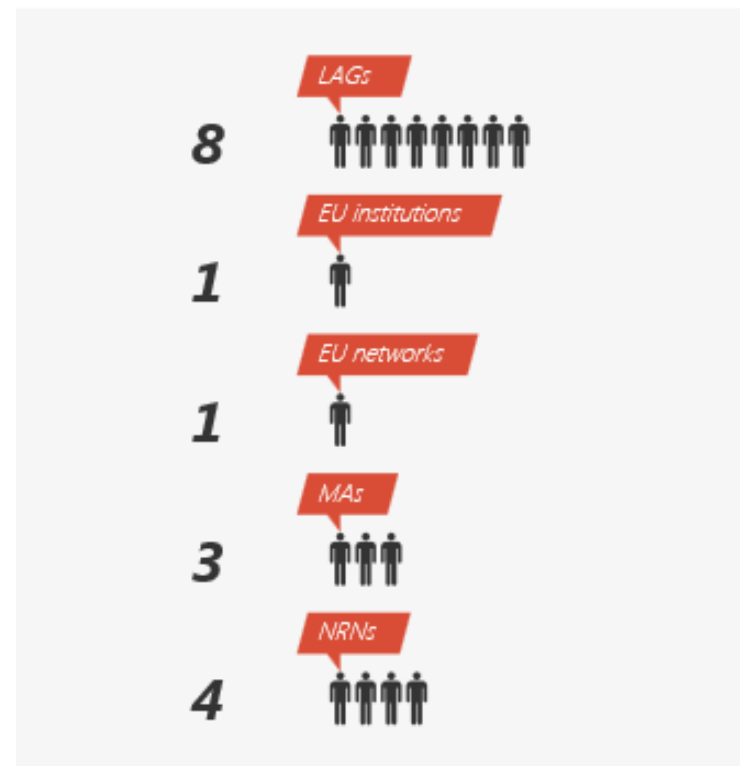
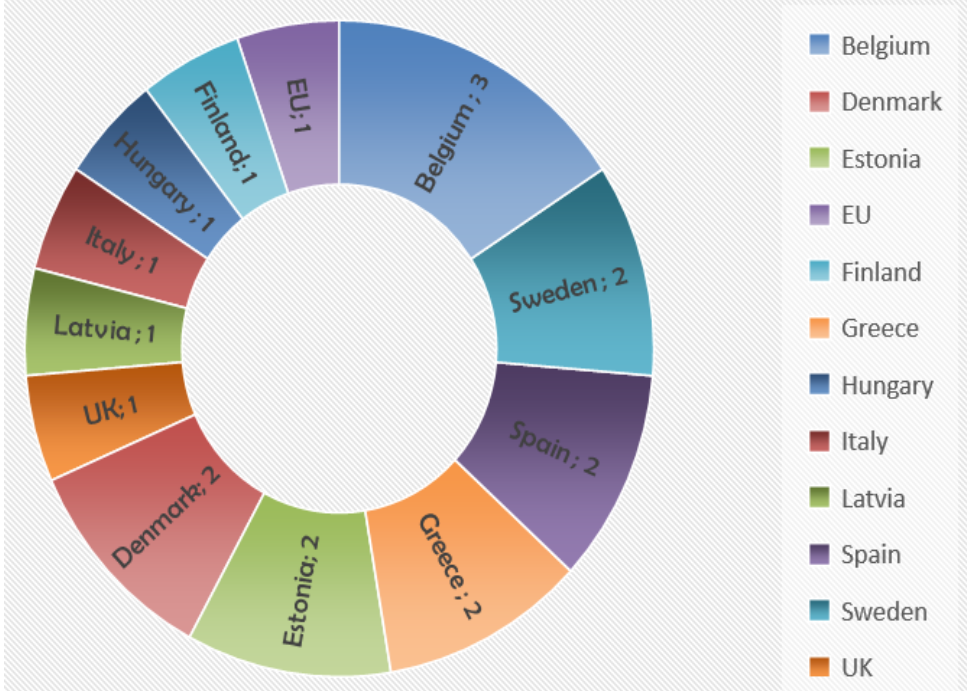

The Cooperation PWG so far

Themes

- the "ideal" process for TNC
- developing a common template (cooperation agreement)
- coordinating the selection and approval of TNC projects
- common definitions (joint action, common cost)
- EU calendar of TNC calls for projects
- demonstrating the the "added value" of TNC
- preparatory support for TNC

Membership

- 46 members from 20 EU member states + other networks, organisations (FARNET, ELARD, EURAF) and the European Commission
- 16 members are also members of the LEADER Sub-Group
- 17 Local Action Groups, 7 Managing Authorities, 3 Paying Agencies, 11 NRNs/NSUs in membership
- EU MSs represented: AT, BE, HR, EE, FI, DE, EL, HU, IE, IT, LV, LT, PL, PT, SK, SL, ES, SE, NL, UK

Key messages to date

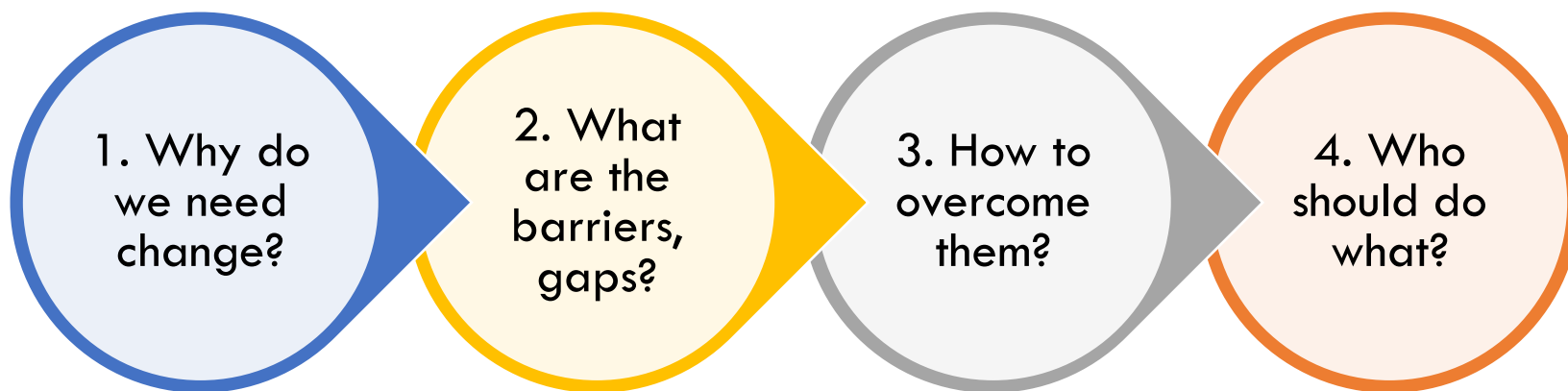
- proposed elements of 'ideal' TNC process include allocation of cooperation budget to LAGs, selection of projects by LAGs, networking support to LAGs by NRNs, the importance of understanding the use of preparatory support for "exploring" project feasibility, the coordinated submission of project applications
- common definition of 'joint action' and 'common costs' proposed
- a generic template for cooperation agreements proposed
- several examples of relevant EU MS practice available online
