2007-2013 Programming period – Reg (CE) 1698/2005

- **✓** ENRD Art. 67(b): ... **good rural development practices.**
- ✓ NRNs Art. 68(b): ... good transferable practices ..."

2014-2020 Programming period- Reg (EU) 1305/2013

- ✓ ENRD Art. 52 3(a): ... good rural development practices.
- **✓** NRNs Art. 54, 3(b)(i): ... **collection of examples of projects**

Legislative proposal CAP post-2020

✓ CAP Networks Art. 113, 4(c) "collection and dissemination of **good practice**"; 4(a) "collection and dissemination of information..."





Project examples and good practices

Project examples

Important tool to disseminate and communicate the results of strategies/policies/programmes

- √ They refer to projects
- ✓ Focus on good results
- ✓ Transparency
- ✓ No specific selection criteria





Project examples and good practices





"Good practice" might refer to strategies, programmes, projects, procedures, management and implementation practices...

A good practice should be at least:

- ✓ Implemented with positive results.
- ✓ Successful, (innovative), tested and validated: it contributes to the improved performance of an entrepreneurship/farm/organisation and this contribution is recognised.
- ✓ Transferable: it can be adopted in and adapted to other contexts.





Project examples and good practices



Good Practices – key aspects

✓ To set up a selection process based on clear and simple criteria.

✓ To analyse also **negative aspects, failures, obstacles....** These findings will contribute to **draw lessons** .

- ✓ To consider different aspects of the same practice.
- ✓ To ensure **follow up** on selected practices.
- ✓ Good practices are key in the capitalisation process.

Build on the experience and knowledge



The "capitalisation" is usually understood as a process that allows to take advantage of already existing practical experiences and to use them to create a tangible "capital" of knowledge and improve performance.

2. Have a good overview of the existing practices and select them.

- ✓ Define clear objectives and plan the process accordingly.
- ✓ Use information collected to capitalise the experience and to improve planning (strategies and programmes) and projects implementation.
- ✓ Share and disseminate the right information to the right people: chose carefully targets and tools of communication and dissemination plan.

✓ Use information collected in different activities to maximise its positive influence.
